ANNUAL ACTIVITY REPORT FOR APRIL 2015 –MARCH 2016

Introduction:

Rural Workers Development Society was founded in the year 2007 by a group of public minded leaders those who are effectively concerning in community development activities for more than three decades. It was registered under Tamilnadu Societies Registration Act vide Registration number 93/2007. Its head quarters are located in Ramanathapuram. RWDS is working among children, women, youth, farmers, rural unorganized workers especially Palmyrah Workers in Ramnad District.

Vision:

- To make them understand their condition and motivate them to participate in their development through awareness generation.
- To improve their bargaining power and to link with Govt and formal institutions for self reliance and substances.
- To enable for adequate health and education to Children for better tomorrow.

Working Areas:

Ramanathapuram is situated along the Eastern coastal District of the Southern Tamilnad. The Bay of Bengal in the east, The Calf of manner in the whole sea shore, Sivagangai, Pudukottai, Virudhunagar, and Tuticorin constitute its boundaries. Spreading over an area of 4232 sq'km. It cradles a population of 12, 58,772 Persons. This District is divided into 11 development Blocks and it has the highest population of urban population among the major districts. The incidence of poverty and drought is highest among the 30 districts. Ramnad has also a population of scheduled castes 28% children compose 27.2% of the population.

Project operational area is located in Ramanathapuram District in Southern part of Tamil Nadu (650 Km away from Chennai). Drinking water is acute problem. Women have to walk miles together to fetch water, and it is very difficult to get pure, soft and potable water irrespective of Government efforts. In brief Ramanathapuram is a most backward and underdeveloped district in terms of Socio-Economic and industrial development

ACTIVITIES

1. CLC (Child Labor Committee) MEETING

Prevention of child labor and mainstreaming them to education is one of our main objectives. We had identified 318 child labors among 4821 in our 52 target villages. Among them 70% of the child labors are in Kadaladi block. We had mobilized them as Child Labor Committee. The CLC has been actively functioning in 11 villages of Kadaladi block. In this committee they meet every week and enjoy the childhood. We had facilitated them to reenroll in schools and other technical institutions as the child wish. For this year we had conducted 38 meetings in which 59 boys and 108 girls were took part and benefited.

In this meetings plastic wire basket making training given as alternative livelihood to 15 child labours from N.Kamarajapuram, Periyanyakipuram, PP Kudiyeruppu, Manickanagar and M.Gandhinagar villages.

2. CHILD LABOR PARENTS COMMITTEE

We do number of activities to eradicate the child labor practice. To boost the activity we had decided to promote Parents Committee of Child Labor in our target villages. The committee can help us to generate more rapport with parents and give parents more understandings about the evils of child labor.

During this year we had promoted Child Labor Parents Committee in 1.Ayyanarpuram, 2.Kannikapuri, 3.Puduvalasai, 4.Thavukadu, 5.Thamaraioorani, 6.N.Kamarajapuram, 7.Manickanagar, 8.Periya Mayakulam, 9.Selvanayakipuram, 10.Kila Allikulam, 11.Elanthaikulam, 12.Vellapatti, 13.Kuthiraimozhi Pandianagar villages. We had conduct meeting of this committee ones in two months and discussed about the demerits of child labor practice. We had insisted about importance of child hood and education.

3. RESOLUTIONS AT GRAMA SABHA

We facilitated the Palmyrah Sangam members and village volunteers to participate in the Gramasabha meetings held on 1st May 2015, 15th August 2015, 2nd October 2015 and 26th January 2016.

Resolutions were passed

- (1)Puduvalasai Panchayat - drinking water facility to ICDS, Child labor free Panchayat, school dropout free Panchyat, child marriage free Panchyat and dowry free Panchayat,
- (2)Retaioorani Panchayat - water facility to toilet at Government Higher secondary school, school dropout free Panchayat, child marriage free Panchayat and child labor free Panchayat,
- (3)Kuthakottai Panchyat - road repair from Kuthakottai to Methalodai and Toilet facility to School and ICDS at Methalodai village, Child labor free Panchayat and School dropout free Panchayat
- (4)Naripaioor Panchayat - new building to ICDS of Periyayakipuram, N.Kamarajapuram, Manickanagar and Veppamarathupanai villages, new primary school at Periyayakipuram and child labor free Panchayat, school dropout free Panchayat.

4. MEETING WITH LABOR INSPECTOR OF RAMNAD & TUTICORIN

Our organization has been taken more actions to prevent child labor practice in our target villages. This year we had collect child data of 52 target villages, in which child labor list was prepared. We had identified 318 child labor are in the target villages.

To insist the Government to get into on the issue, we had have meetings with Inspector of Labor, Ramanathapuram on 14.07.2015 and Inspector of Labor, Tuticorin on 27.07.2015 and submitted memorandum of Child Labors in target villages. Inspector of Labor, Ramanathapuram had assured that he would take immediate action if we locate any child labor below 14 years. Inspector of Labor, Tuticorin had assured that he will take actions against child labor with line departments like Child Line, NCLP.

5. MEDICAL CAMP for Child Labors

The child labors working in salt pane company is working in high heat and unhygienic place. They are suffering from skin disease and urinal problems. The child labor working in sea Food Company is working in high cold place and not wearing gloves. They also affected by skin disease, low hp and urinal and menstrual problems.

We plan to monitor the health of the child labor of Salt Pane Company and Sea Food Company. For this purpose we did health checkup for ones in two months. In this health checkup 23 child labors from Periyanyakipuram, Manickanagar, Kamarajapuram, Vellapatti, Velayuthapuram, Kuthiraimozhil Panidanagar, Elanthaikulam and Boopandiapuram villages were benefited.

6. CC (Children Collective) MEETING

Children age between 6 and 18 in the target villages has organized as a committee to develop their social education and practice the right to participation. Every children age between 6 and 18 are the members of these collectives. The collective meets every week to discuss and share about their wishes. We had given training on leadership, RTE, and comics drawing. The collectives are connected as cluster level as Koravalli, Kilakarai, Uchipulli, Tirupullani, Naripaiyur and Kavakulam.

Children were encouraged with prizes for their performance. Saplings were planted in the villages.

9. 100% SCHOOL ENROLLMENT CAMPAIGN

School enrolment campaign to ensure 100% enrolment in our target villages had conducted during this year in S.Kamarajapuram, V.V.R.Nagar, Vellapatti, Maninkanagar, Kannikapuri, Samayanvalasai, Ammapattinam, N.Kamarajapuram, Velayuthapuram, Periyamayakipuram, PP Kudierupuu, Kilaallikulam, KKK Valasai, Kavakulam, Veppamarathupanai, Masanapuram, Iyyanapuram, Koravalli, Pudumayakulam, T.M.Vadi, K.P.Valasai, Nathakulam, Kumbaram, Periyamayakulam, Boopandiapuram, Puduvalasai, Sengalaneerodai, Kadukkaivalasai, Alaikathavalasai, Chinnaretaioorani, Methalodai North, Methalodai South, Murugananthapuram, Vellariodai, Adanchery, Thavukadu between 07.05.2015 and 28.05.2015, in which 755 people participated including Children Committee members, Palmyra Sangam Members, Parents, Panchayat Members and Public.

ICDS enrolment campaign were conducted in 37 villages and 485 people were took part including Palmyra Sangam members, Parents and Children.

10. A study on the status of children in the Migrant families of Palmyra workers in Ramnad

A detailed study on Migrated Families and Children in Kadaladi Block, Ramanathapuram district was conducted. As per our plan we had had a details study about the migrated families who is engaged in Palmyrah tapping in 11 palmyrah groves – 1.Periyakulam, 2.Chathiram, 3.Kannikapuri Sevalkadu, 4.Ellaipinchai, 5.Kadugusanthai, 6.Kannirajapuram Sevelkadu, 7.Tharaikudi, 8.Boopandiapuram Sevelkadu, 9.Kumbasalai, 10.Kilaallikulam, 11.Kuthiraimozhi Sevalkadu .

One questionnaire was prepared by the staff team and it was used to collect data from the migrated families. For this study the staff team was split into 4 groups each group has 2 members in which Programme coordinator and the Project Director had the monitoring role.

We had completed the data collection in 11 areas. We prepared the report.

@ The migrant children have to travel minimum 5km to maximum 30km. Most of the 3 - 10 yrs children are being school dropouts. The total school dropout is 85.

* The children could not have transport facility most of the children have to walk for minimum 2km to 5km to reach the main road where they get the auto or van to go to school. They have to pay Rs.400 - Rs.600, as per the distance, for the vehicle per month per child.

11. ONE TO ONE HOUSEHOLD MEETING

One to one household approach is to generate more rapport with parents and children in our target villages. By this strategy we can promote a live relationship with every family. We can have more understanding about the children and their needs. In this regard our team had visited all the 4821 target families every three months.

12. Meeting with School HM & Teachers:

Children of migrant families are different from other children. They are live in a different situation where no basic facilities like water, electricity, transport and hospital. So, we could treat the children in different way and positively understand their late coming, unfinished

homeworks, and irregularity in attendees. To make aware the school HM and Teachers we had special meetings with them. During this year we had met HM and Teachers in schools of Koravalli, Vellariodai, Kuyavankudi, Kannikapuri, Elanthaikulam, Masanapuram, and Kuthiraimozhi Pandianagar villages.

13. SMC TRAINING

Education is the basic right, we know. To practice the basic right, RTE 2009 gives a wonderful opportunity to parents to act positively in promoting their school. School Management Committee (SMC) is the opportunity to the parents of all villages. After the implementation of the RTE 2009, the Government had taken no proper steps to activate the SMC in appropriate way. The education officials including HM and Teachers also give no importance to SMC. They treat just like a burden. No, school had have School Development Plan meeting is SMC in our target villages, which gives space to parents to input their ideas and wishes. So generate awareness on SMC to parents we could reach proper implementation of RTE 2009.

For this purpose we had conducted Training on SMC to parents in 5 villages, Kannikapuri, Melakidaram, Vellapatti, Kilaallikulam and Boopandiapuram. Mr.C.J.Rajan, Samam Kudimakkal Iyakkam, Madurai, had facilitated the training. He explained how the SMC system is promoted by the RTE 2009 act. He also detailed about the roles and

15. CAMPAIGN TO GET NEW PRIMARY SCHOOL TO SENGALANEERODAI & PERIYANAYAKIPURAM

New primary school to Sengalaneerodai and Periyayakipuram village is an important need. Sengalaneerodai village is situated in Kanchirankudi Panchayat and 6km far from Kilakarai town. The village had 250 population and 52 children, age 3 – 5, but, here is no school. The children have to walk for 12km up and down even primary education. This situation is increasing school dropouts in primary school also.

Periyayakipuram, Rayappapuram and Kamarajapuram villages has 600 population including 143 children age 3 – 5. These villages are in Naripaioor panchayat, Kadaladi Taluk. These villages have situated other side of Kanniyakumari to Rameswaram ECR road while the Primary school is in next side of that road. Children have to walk for 6km up and down; also crossing the ECR road is being dangerous.

In this regard education task force committee for new primary school to Sengalaneerodai and Periyayakipuram had taken number of steps. Last year, Sengalaneerodai villagers had filed case in Madras high court of Madurai bench on New Primary School and got an order insisted the Government to provide primary school within 8weeks. During this reporting period both the villagers had met with the Registrar of Madras High Court of Madurai bench and submitted memorandum about the

- On 20.04.2015 petition campaign was held in District Collector office, Ramanathapuram regarding new primary school to Sengalaneerodai and Periyayakipuram village. In this campaign 85 people including Sanga members, women, parents and village leaders took part

- On 16.05.2015 copy of High court order on New Primary school to Sengalaneerodai village had submitted to SCPCR and NCPCR by Mr.Pandi, President, Sengalaneerodai village.
- On 08.07.2015 petition was submitted to Dr.M.H.Jawahirullah, MLA, Ramanathapuram Constituency, regarding new primary school to Sengalaneerodai village by village people and RWDS.
- On 06.08.2015 RTI petition was filed regarding new primary school to Sengalaneerodai village.
- List of Children, age between 6 – 10 from Sengalaneerodai village, was submitted to Mrs.Pushpabai, District Coordinator, SSA, Ramanathapuram regarding new primary school.
- An RTI petition was filed regarding new primary school for Sengalaneerodai village and reply received.
- A memorandum submitted to the District Collector on 22.02.2016 regarding new primary school for Sengalaneerodai village.
- News Published – the issue, new primary school for Sengalaneerodai village was published in Dinakaran daily news paper on 23.03.2016. The article was told that for last 7 years the villagers have been waiting for new school.

16. CAMPAIGN ON ICDS

We are working for the pre – primary education of children between 3 – 5 years in our target villages. Among 52 target village 36 ICDS are functioning while other 10 villages had no ICDS in the village, the children have to go for other village and infrastructure and functioning of the ICDS is more pathetic. To ensure the proper pre-primary education to our target children we had campaign regarding its function, infrastructure and staff appointments.

Steps taken regarding new ICDS to Ammapattinam village;

- Petition submitted to Dr.M.H.Jawahirullah, MLA, Ramanathapuram Constituency, regarding ICDS building to Ammapattinam village by village people and RWDS.

- On 03.08.2015 petition was submitted to District Collector of Ramanathapuram regarding new ICDS to Ammapattinam village.
- On 08.08.2015 memorandum was submitted to Dr.S.Sundarrajan, Minister for Sports and Youth Welfare regarding new ICDS to Ammapattinam village.
- Petition submitted to Mr.R.Dharmar, District Secretary to AIADMK of Ramanathapuram district regarding new ICDS to Ammapattinam village.
- A petition regarding ICDS for Ammapattinam village submitted to the District Collector.

17. MEDIA CAMPAIGN

To highlight the issue of migrant children and child labor in Palmyrah Worker family we had a media campaign by Pudiathalaimurai TV. The Video Shoot regarding Media Campaign was happened at Chathiram and Kadukuchanthai area in which Palmyrah tappers, children, and women were focused by Pudiya Thalaimurai TV.

18. VILLAGE LEVEL HEALTH COMMITTEE MEETING

Primary health of the children age between 0 – 5 is one of the most important tool to measure the nation’s development. With this view, we had focused primary health of children age between 0 – 18, ANC, PNC, and Adolescents of our target villages. To achieve this goal we had conducted Village Level Health Sensitizing Meetings. During this reporting period we had organized meetings in T.M.Vadi,

Singarathoppu, Poopandiapuram, Ammapattinam, Kavakulam, Keelavalasai, Alaikathavalasai, Iyanarpuram, Pullanthai, Sengalaneerodai, Kannigapuri, Thavukadu, Methalodai, in which Medical officers, Mobile Doctors, Staff nurse, VHN, AWW and SHN were the resource persons.

Around 700 people including ANC, PNC, Adolescent girls, village health committee representatives, Palmyrah Sangam representatives and other public were took part in these meetings actively. The resource person had sensitize the village people regarding the importance of health particularly ANC, PNC and children age between 0 – 5, and explained about the health services provided in the Government Primary Health centers. They had also detailed about the government health schemes available in the PHC and how to get.

19. PHC LEVEL HEALTH CONVERGENZE MEETING

To ensure the health of our target people, we had health committees in the villages. The committees have a register about ANC, PNC, Adolescents and children aged between 0 – 5. They had facilitated the VHN to get health service to their villagers. In this regard, we had organized PHC level health convergence meetings to create a rapport among the Medical Doctors, VHN, Health workers of PHC and health committees. The resource persons were explained about the services, infrastructures and Government schemes available in the PHCs. ANC, PNC, Adolescent girls and Village Health Committee representatives were being active in the meeting. During this reporting period 9 meetings were organized at Sayalkudi, Thiru Uthirakosamanga, and Uchipulli.

Rs.102,800 as maternity aid from Government of Tamilnadu under Dr.Muthulaxmi Reddy scheme and Janani Sureksha Scheme for PNCs in our target villages.

To activate the HSC of Pullanthai village, a petition to Block Medical Officer of Block PHC, Thiruuthirakosamangai, was submitted by cadres of Pudumayakulam, Periyamayakulam and Pullanthai villages. Block Medical Officer of Thiruuthirakosamangai PHC had assured to

take action on repair the HSC building, Kanchirankudi village.

20. SAMA KALVI IYAKKAM (SKI)

Samakalvi Iyakkam - Tamilnadu has been conducted Study on Closure of Schools in Tamilnadu. In this campaign, RWDS, had participate and study conducted in four Government schools from Elanthaikulam village of Kadaladi block, Korakoottam village of Tirupullani, Nathakulam village of Mandapam block and Vennathur village of Ramanathapuram block.

Study on Child Marriage and Child Labor was done by Samakalvi Iyakkam – Tamilnadu. In this regard our team had studied 10 child marriage cases and 20 child labor cases. We had sent case stories of child marriage and child labor also.

21. Activation of PLCPC

As per the resolution passed in the Gramasaba meeting Panchyat level Child Protection Committee meeting was held at Naripaioor. In this meeting President of the Panchayat, Representative from DCPU, VAO, representative from RWDS, and Child line were participated. In this meeting three resolutions were made that 1. Fix Awareness Board on Child Labour, 2. Special awareness letter to Village committee leaders and 3. Awareness meeting with school teachers.

22. Palmyrah Sangam Cluster Meetings:

To attain development of the Palmyrah workers and their children we formed Palmyra Workers as Panai Thozhilalar Sangam. The Sangam has its function as village level, Cluster level and District level. Every level there is a governing body consists of 1 President, 1 vice president, 1 Secretary, 1 Joint secretary and 1 Treasurer. The village Sangam meets every month and the Cluster Sangam meets once in two months and the District level committee meets yearly once.

23. CAPACITY BUILDING ON ICPS & JJB TO STAFF

The main objectives of the organization are Prevention of Child Labor, Continue Education of Children age between 3 – 18 and Ensure 0% school dropout among migrated families in our target area. To attain these objectives, we have to sensitize and build capacities of our staff team.

In this regard we had a series of training and orientation meeting on ICPS (Integrated Child Protection Scheme), a central government scheme totally planed for children under age 18.



1. Training on JJ Act (Juvenile Justice Act) and CLPRA (Child Labor Prevention and Regulation Act) was held on 30.05.2015 and 16.11.2015. Mr.C.J.Rajanj, Director, Samam Kudimakkal Iyakkam, had facilitated the training. We discussed about the services of JJ Board, CWC and DCPU. We could understand the law CLPRA.

2. Training on Child line to Staff had conducted on 31.08.2015 at Office. Mr.Karuppasamy, Director of TRRM and Child Line, District Nodal Office had facilitated the training.

3. Orientation to staff about CWC was held on 15.10.2015 in which Mrs.Sakunthala, District President, CWC had facilitated. She pointed out that the CWC is for the children who in need of care and protection. We concentrate on orphan children, semi orphan children, dropout children, street children, she added. We give counseling to the needy children and their parents and take the children in Government approved homes if they like.

4. Orientation to staff regarding JJB was held on 20.10.2015 by Mr.Murugesan, Member in JJB, Ramanathapuram district. If children under 18 years connect with an incident which is unlawful, we investigate the case.

5. Orientation regarding DCPU was held on 29.10.2015 by Mrs.Vasanthakumari, DCPU, Ramanathapuram. She added that we work for the children need of care and protection. We implement sponsorship schemes for the children. We regularly monitored the homes function in our district.

Our staff team including project director, project coordinator, documentation officer, child labor coordinator, accountant and 6 development workers had actively participate in these training and learn about the ICPS.

Achievements 2015 -2016:

1. Drinking water tank was, with 1000 ltr capacity, fixed by TWAD board in Panchayat Union School, Koravalli and Panchayat provide water.
2. Resolution on ban on dowry system in the village was passed in Sanga meeting at Chinna Rettaioorani village.

3. Drinking water tap to Nadar Street of Puduvalasai village had fixed and people are happy.
4. New ICDS building was sanctioned to Ammapattinam village and the village leaders had follow up.
5. Three children (1)Murugasurya 4th s/o Adaikalam, (2)Uthisraj 4th s/oSinkaraj and (3)Kopika 2nd d/o Muthukumar were reenrolled from Little Star Matriculation school to NMS Sermathai Vasasn Government aided school in Periyamayakulam village on 16.07.2015.
